## Message from the Diocesan Bishop

Dear Friends in Christ,

February witnessed the 120<sup>th</sup> Maramon Convention of our Church, organized by the Evangelistic Association on the banks of River Pampa. By the grace of God all the meetings went smoothly and I could see some of the members of our diocese at Maramon. Though it has become a very historic and unique event among the spiritual gatherings in the world, our Church is organizing it for all sorts of people. It is also a time for serious Bible Study. One of the new beginnings we had this year was the opening of a Hindi stall, where people from different language areas in India, outside Kerala, could gather together to get more information and also to feel at home in our church event. Let us look forward to the days when there will be some non-Malayalam songs and prayers incorporated into the main section of the meetings and non-Malayalam speaking communities can hear the summary of the messages in their own language.

We have two Theological Colleges in India, the Mar Thoma Theological Seminary, in Kerala and the Dharma Jyoti Vidya Peeth, in Haryana near Delhi. Both are residential colleges which groom students, as they learn academic subjects, to become spiritual leaders and to witness the Lord through their lives. Both campuses have students from different language areas, men and women, doing their graduate and post-graduate studies. Right now we have four students studying there from our parishes in the US. When I visited these centers in the month of February, I could see the modern trends in our church to become more inclusive and welcoming. We are having more and more spiritual leaders coming up from different language areas. The Dharma Jyoti campus is 'going green' by having solar system for light and heat and promotes mission and ministry in the villages of India that give emphasis to overall sustainable development of the village communities. This year, the Theological Seminary, Kottayam organized a National Seminar on Diaspora/Migration Studies. This opened windows for serious discussion on these topics to understand the modern challenges the Church is facing and the forms of ministry that evolves out of it.

We have entered into the season of Great Lent when we focus our attention to the Cross of Christ. Let us embark on a spiritual journey into the mystery and wonder of a unique death on a Friday afternoon that leads us to astounding experiences of resurrection on Easter morning, which altogether continues to reveal to us the truth about everything. Let this Lent renew and refresh us to make us new and to understand the meaning of life that is worth-living. I wish everyone a blessed season.

## Maramon Convention 2015



The 120th Maramon Convention was held on the sand-bed of River Pampa at Maramon from February 8 to 15, 2015. The convention started on February 8 with the opening prayer led by Valiya Metropolitan Philipose Mar Chrisostom and the inaugural message by Joseph Mar Thoma Metropolitan. Thomas Mar Timotheos Episcopa, the MTEA president presided over the session. Philipose Mar Chrisostom Valiya Metropolitan, Zacharias Mar Theophilus

Suffragan Metropolitan and the Episcopos Geevarghese Mar Theodosius, Joseph Mar Barnabas, Mathews Mar Makarios, Gregorios Mar Stephanos and Thomas Mar Theethos gave powerful messages during the different sessions of the convention. In addition to our bishops, Bishop Siphon De Siva of South Africa, Rev. Samuel T. Kamalesan of the United States and Rev. Dushantha Rodrigo of Sri Lanka were speakers. The Patriarch of Antioch Iganthios Mor Aprem II in his first visit to India after his consecration as Patriarch attended and blessed the Maramon Convention by his message on Friday, February 13<sup>th</sup>. Our Diocesan Episcopa gave the message on Wednesday February 11, 2015 evening based on Philippians 2:1-8. Thirumeni through his message exhorted that the local parishes should reveal Christ more and more and do the ministry of the Kingdom of God. Dr. Geevarghese Mar Theodosius visited the Mar Thoma Theological Seminary, Kottayam from February 17<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>, 2015 to participate and lead the national seminar on Diaspora/Migration studies on the theme: Interrogating borders – Migration and Transnationalism. The inaugural address was given by Mar Theodosius at the opening ceremony at the seminary chapel on the evening of Tuesday February 17, 2015. Thirumeni presented a paper on 'Shifting Meanings in Public, Religious and Domestic spaces: Theological, Ministerial and Missional challenge'. There were 50 delegates from different parts of the country apart from the students and faculty members of the Seminary. Dr. Sebastian Irudaya Rajan (CDS, Trivandrum), Dr. P.P. Ravendran (M.G. Pothen, Principal of the Seminary and Rev. Dr. P.G. George, Dean of Studies, SATHRI, Serampore University. This seminar has brought awareness to the Church and Seminary community on the significance of studies on migration. It will certainly help the Church to recognize the evolving trends on Church's ministry and mission.
